Dumfries**

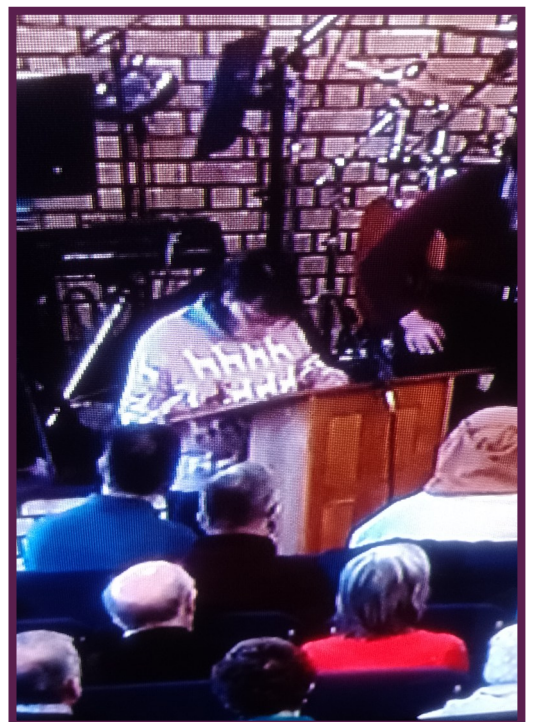
I came to know Jesus through a visiting man speaking at the Bible Truth church when I came back to Scotland from Australia.

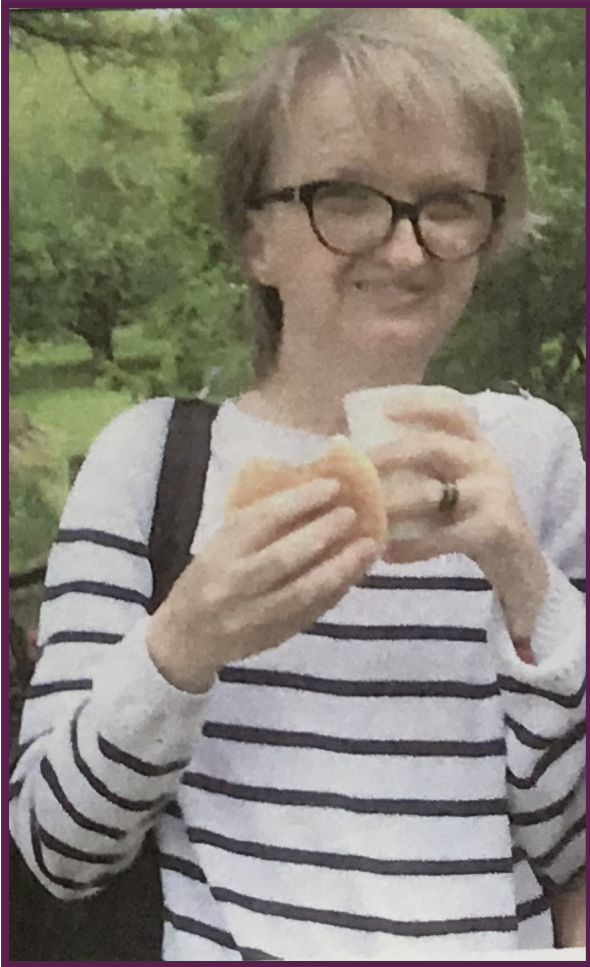
When I was younger I went to a special school in Irvine and then another special school in Kilmarnock. I can't say I have happy memories of school days.

Lots of people prayed when I had further surgery and one day when guisers were at the door Jesus told me to get up and walk. My mum got a shock to see me there!

When we moved to Kinross-shire we joined Kinross Church. I played the piano for the collection song at Sunday School, and at 17, I joined the church with 3 others.

I have done over 130 flights gliding including a flight for charity. At pottery I made lots of things for friends and the Church Sale. I did horse carriage driving and wheelchair curling. Now I play Boccia. MAF and Air Ambulance are my favourite charities and I made pottery planes for both. I also did a trike ride for Christian Aid.

I have spoken at meetings and conferences. I did church leadership training with two elders. This helped me with praying. I am part of the church Welcome Team and the Minister's Sunday evening prayers.

I was part of Faith and Light and Prospects in Dunfermline. I wanted our own Prospects Group so I asked the minister. For nine years we have had All Friends Together and at our last gathering nearly 40 were at lunch. I do the welcome and play the piano for birthdays. I was on the committee of Scottish Churches Disability Group. I am also on our Church Accessibility Group. I love Prospects and go to many of their groups on Zoom

Rebekah was baptised at Nicolson Square Methodist Church in Edinburgh and throughout childhood spent Sundays travelling around East Lothian, Edinburgh and Fife (Edinburgh and Forth circuit) as both her parents were Methodist local preachers. She took part in Sunday School along with her sisters and always enjoyed hymns and children's choruses. She attended confirmation classes with her elder sister Ruth and became a member of Livingston Ecumenical Parish in December 2008.

In 2009 Rebekah was a founding member of SPRED Livingston encouraged by local priest Father Jeremy Bath. Over the years she formed lovely relationships with her catechists, particularly enjoying the sharing of food and the farewell 'Shalom' song at the end of each meeting.

Rebekah's life of worship was further expanded when she joined her local Prospects Across Scotland, 'Friends of Jesus' at Breich Valley Church in 2012. She takes part in craft activities using stickers and gluing/stamping craft materials and uses a BIGmack communicator to offer a Bible reading during worship.

Since 2013 Rebekah has been a member of her local church, Livingston South Community Church, where she is very well known by her church family. She enjoys clapping and rocking during worship when she recognises old hymns that she has known for many years. She likes the social time after services sitting round the table with friends, listening to the chat.

Rebekah has Down syndrome, autism and a profound learning disability so it is challenging to understand what Jesus means to her but sharing worship with her brothers and sisters in Christ in many different ways has enabled her to feel part of God's family and be accepted as one of God's children. The words of a Prospects song come to mind - 'God loves you just the way you are'.

What do I think about Jesus? He gives me joy, joy, joy down in my heart. One of my favourite songs is 'He's got the whole world in his hands' – when we sing it makes me feel safe. God's got me in his hands – that's good.

I live by myself which I like but sometimes my neighbours are a problem. During the week I help in a charity shop, I also attend groups at Sutherland House in Ayr where I do different things and I really like my aquatrim classes at Troon swimming pool.

I like to watch the 'soaps' on TV particularly 'Corrie' and 'Emmerdale' but I also particularly like 'Vera'.

When JAM started, I loved it. They told bible stories in a way I could understand. We sometimes act out the stories, one day I was King David. We pray in a way that's easy for me, we even play games to help us understand the story. We sing lots of songs, my favourite is 'Welcome Everybody'. At the end of our worship, we have tea, coffee and cakes.

Loving Jesus is important to me as he was a very kind person and he died for us. I'm so lucky to have my church family at Inchinnan church and also my JAM family who I know all love me the way Jesus does.
